Q11 Did your institution oblige you to follow one or more course(s) in Dutch language and/or culture?

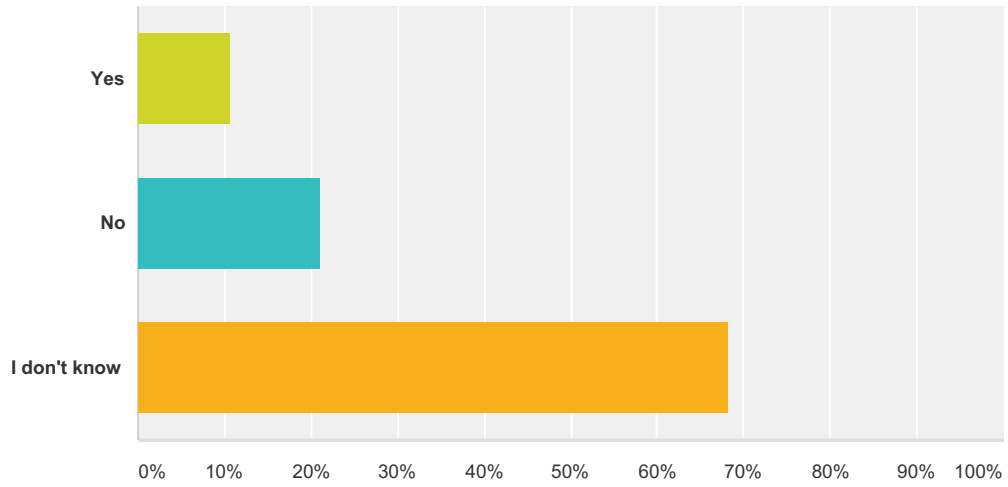

Q12 Do you intend to stay in the Netherlands for a master programme after you graduate?

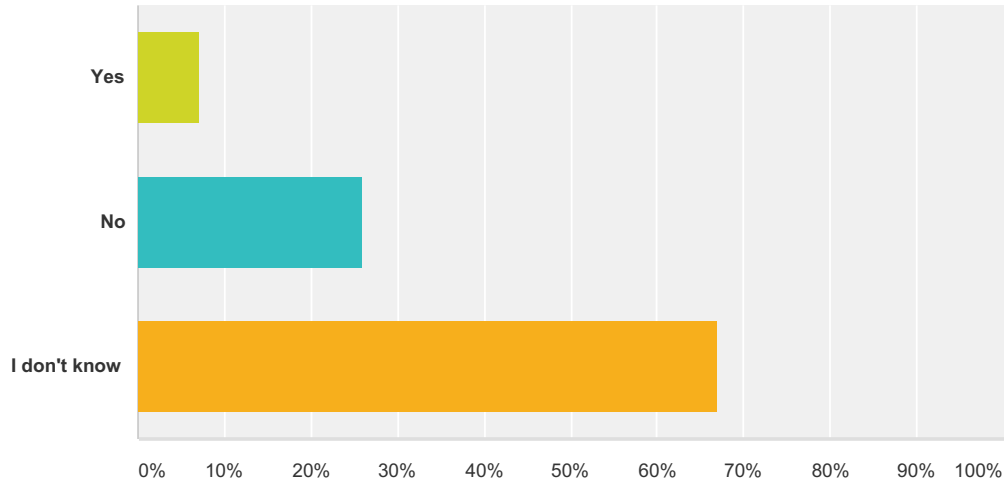

Q13 Do you intend to stay in the Netherlands to work after you graduate either your current programme or your masters programme?

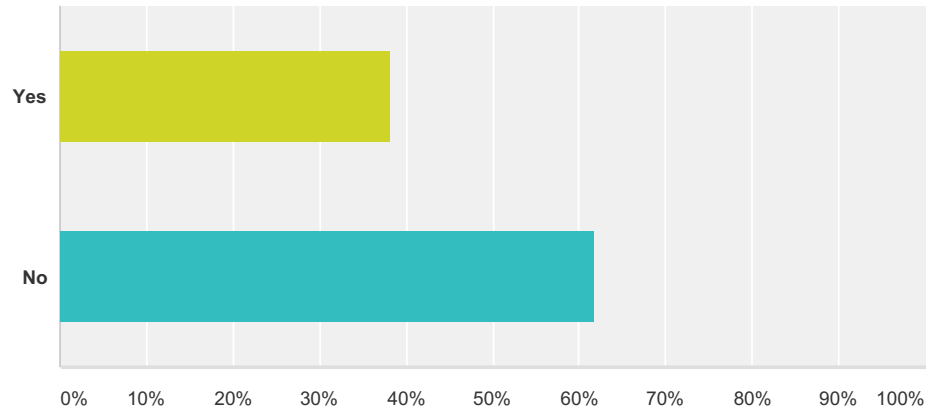

Q14 Did you apply to other programmes while applying to your current programme?

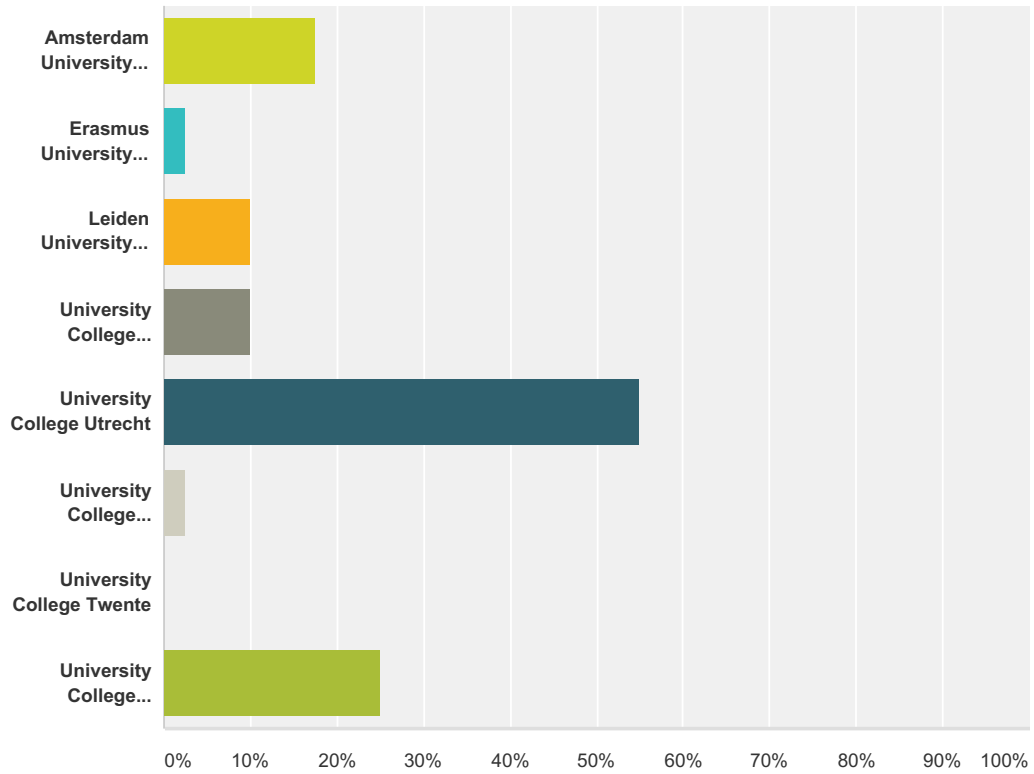

Q15 Select which other University College programmes you have applied to

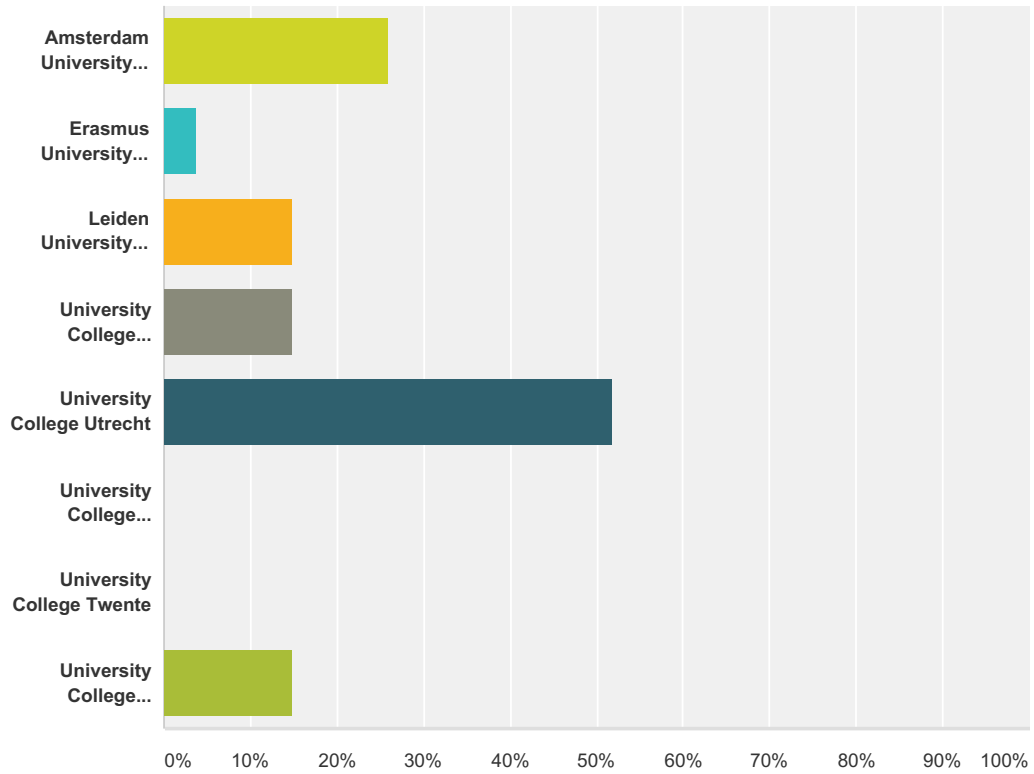

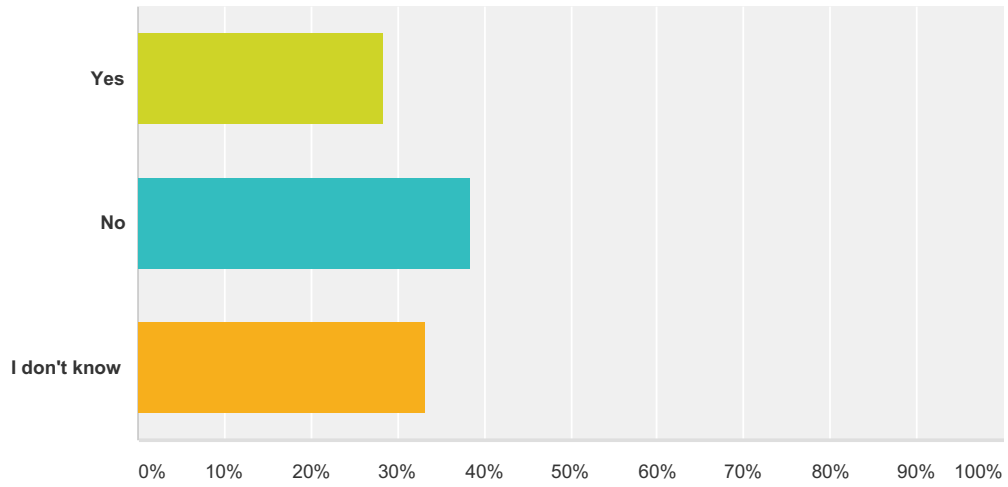

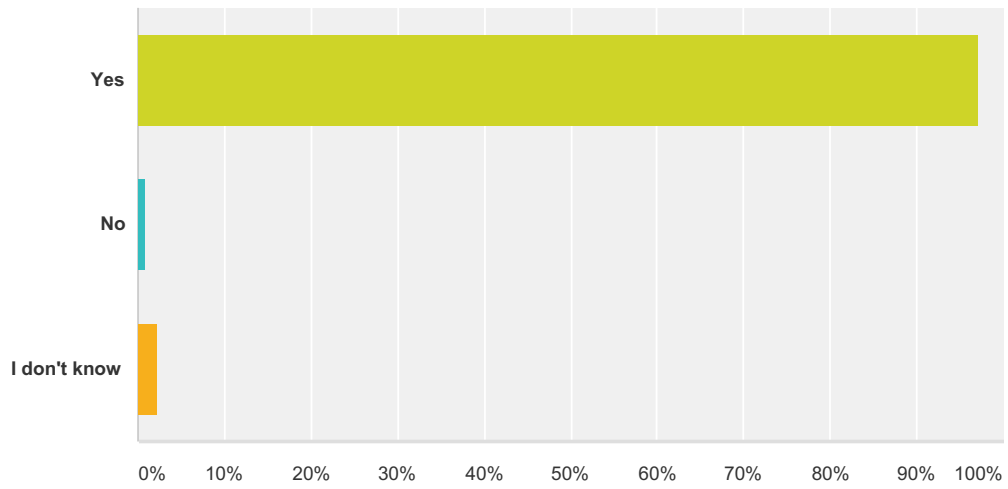

Q30 According to your current plan, where will you pursue your masters degree?

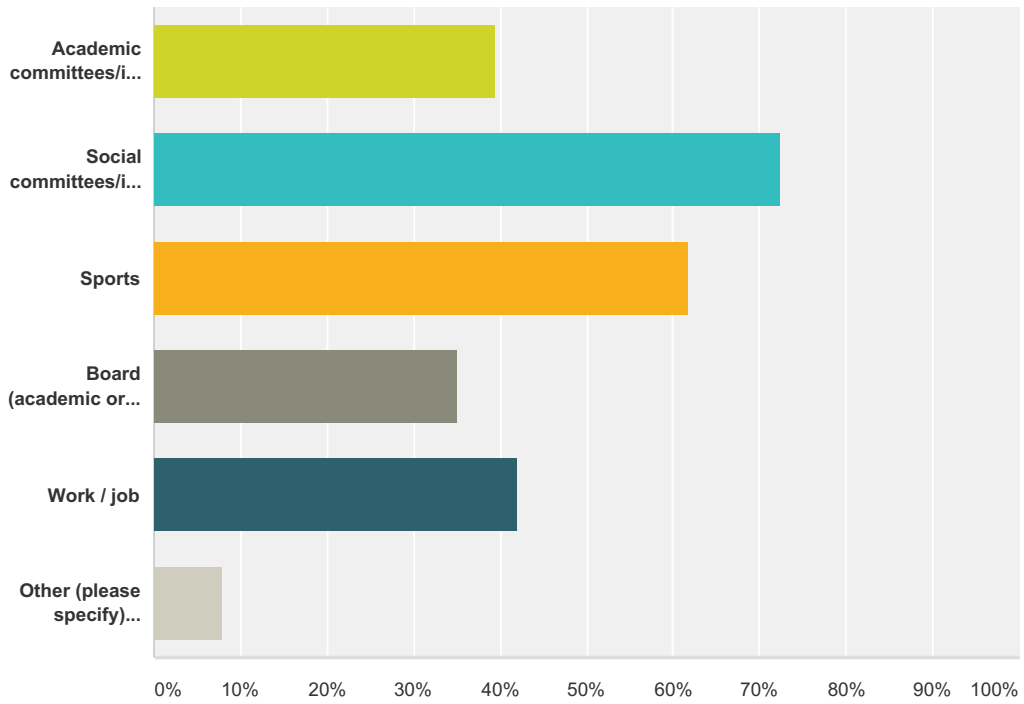
